

Fees and funding

With very generous scholarships and fee waivers on offer this is a very good year to be starting a science or engineering degree course at Teesside University. This document provides only a brief summary of fees and funding. Briefly:

- The fee is £9,250* for courses leading to a BSc, MSci, BEng or MEng award
- Reduced fees of £4,500 apply for the final year of MSci and MEng degrees
- Full fee waiver (zero fees) apply for the work placement year (other universities charge fees ranging from several hundred pounds to over £1,000)
- A number of scholarships are available for science and engineering degrees worth up to £5,000 (you need to apply for these).

Tuition fees

The 2017 tuition fees for UK/EU students starting full-time undergraduate (MEng, BEng, BEng Tech, BSc) degree courses in science and engineering are **£9,250***

Tuition fee loans

A student loan is a risk free investment. You invest in your own future. For most UK/EU students starting university in 2017 there will be nothing to pay upfront for your education. Your fees will be paid by the Student Loan Company directly to the University and you will not be required to pay anything towards your student loan until you graduate and your UK earnings exceed £21,000 (the threshold varies by country and may be different for students working overseas).

Your repayments will be taken out of your salary at the same time as tax and National Insurance if you're an employee. Your payslips will show how much has been deducted.

Maintenance loan for living costs

The loan is paid directly into your bank account at the start of term. You have to pay the loan back. You may have to give details of your household income. EU students can't apply for maintenance loans. The amount you can borrow depends on whether

you will be living at home or away from home during your studies, your household income and where you live (in London, or outside London).

MEng / MSci Programmes

- If you study on an integrated Master's (MEng or MSci) course and pay home/EU fees, you pay a reduced fee of £4,500 for your final year.

Courses with a work placement year (course titles that include either 'with Industry' or 'with Professional Experience')

- Teesside University will waive the full tuition fee for a work placement year. If your course includes a work placement (courses with 'industry' or 'professional experience' in their titles) then there will be no fees to pay for the year you are on work placement.

Teesside Kickstart award

- We will award you £500 to support you in year one of your course. You could use it for travel, accommodation or other living expenses.

THE GOOD NEWS IS THAT THERE IS NO LIMIT TO THE NUMBER OF FEE WAIVERS AND KICKSTART AWARDS AVAILABLE, AND THERE IS NO APPLICATION PROCESS TO GO THROUGH – YOU WILL RECEIVE THE AWARDS AND FEE WAIVERS THAT YOU ARE ELIGIBLE FOR AUTOMATICALLY, SOON AFTER ENROLMENT ON YOUR COURSE.

In addition to the above, **SCHOLARSHIPS WORTH UP TO £5,000** are available for successful candidates. These are limited in number and you do need to submit an application.
